

OTHER 2G3S NEWS

SOUTH CAMBRIDGESHIRE DISTRICT COUNCIL: ZERO CARBON ACTION PLAN

As reported in the last newsletter, 2G3S, headed by our convenor, **Claire Lord**, has supported parish councils in their bids for funding from this scheme. Specifically: a tree planting consultant and a review of energy efficiency in the Parish Office (Sawston); a tree planting consultant and some trees (with the Playscape Group) (Great Shelford); and an energy efficiency consultant for the Jubilee Hall (Stapleford). The results of these bids should be known before Christmas.

LOCAL TRANSPORT – WOOLLARD’S LANE, GREAT SHELFORD

In August and September 2G3S, organised by **Jim Chisholm**, carried out traffic surveys of Woollard’s Lane, Great Shelford, to assess the feasibility of introducing measures to stop some forms of through traffic (known as ‘modal filters’). Further discussions will be held with the Parish Council, local businesses, and the village Playscape project. (PS – congratulations to Jim on the successful lifting into position of the Abbey Chesterton Bridge on 7 November - a key milestone in the delivery of the flagship Chisholm Trail walking and cycling route!)

CLIMATE CHANGE

The Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Independent Commission on Climate, set up by Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Mayor James Palmer, has launched a [public survey](#) on the most pressing issues of climate change across the region and what action should be taken. AGRICULTURE AND ENVIRONMENT BILLS

The **Agriculture Bill** received its Royal Assent on 11 November and is now the 2020 Agriculture Law. Read the official government announcement [here](#); and the NFU take on it, via 'our guest publication', Pig World, [here](#)

Progress on **The Environment Bill** was suspended due to the pandemic but has now restarted. We are at the Committee stage, and having been scrutinised by a multi-party Bill Committee, the Bill is now being debated in the House again (as of 12 November), so it's a good time to [remind our MP, Anthony Browne](#), to make sure he prioritises nature by engaging in the debates.


